IIM Nagpur signs MoU with Westminster Business School, University of Westminster, UK

The Indian Institute of Management Nagpur (IIMN) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Westminster Business School, University of Westminster (United Kingdom), in a virtual ceremony on Wednesday.
